Volunteer group at Union Station accepting cash donations for Pakistan

On August 30 and 31, GO Transit will work with charitable partners to do its part in raising funds for Pakistan flood-relief efforts. Union Station will host volunteers from Humanity First who will be accepting cash donations towards the relief effort. Volunteers will be located on the GO concourse and outside the bus terminal, on the east side of Bay Street.

The flooding in Pakistan has affected more than 17 million people, killed at least 1,600, injured nearly 1,600 and has destroyed and damaged 1.2 million homes.

“We urge our employees, customers and friends to help the people in Pakistan in any way that they can,” says Gary McNeil, GO Transit Managing Director.

Volunteers will be accepting donations on both days; in the morning from 5:30 to 9:30 a.m., then again in the afternoon from 2:30 until 6:00 p.m.

Humanity First Canada is a Canadian based international humanitarian relief organization, established to provide assistance to those who are less fortunate and help improve the quality of life in under-privileged countries.
